

Amaryllis (Hippeastrum)

Interview with a plant

Amaryllis

“I take a full rest, and then — when warmth and rain arrive — my inner alarm clock goes off and I leap into action”

- Amaryllis (Hippeastrum)

Hi Amaryllis... hello... hello!?

Are you talking to me? My name is Hippeastrum! That Amaryllis you're referring to — that's my cousin from South Africa. I come from Central and South America. We're related, we look alike, and at first, botanists did classify me under the genus Amaryllis. But years later, when it became clear I deserved my own plant genus — Hippeastrum — the name Amaryllis had already stuck in people's minds. The name means "the radiant one" or "the dazzling one", so honestly, I don't mind being called that.

You bloom in winter — how does that work?

Where I come from originally, there are dry and rainy seasons. To survive in that climate, I retreat into my bulb during the dry season. I take a full rest, and then — when warmth and rain arrive — my inner alarm clock goes off and I leap into action. I start growing straight away, and about eight weeks later, I'm in full bloom.


Growers have learned to make good use of this instinct. They give me a rest by storing me dry over the summer. When the time is right, I get warmth and water. That's why it's no problem for me to shine and dazzle in a cosy living room during the festive season.

Some Hippeastrums are sold with a thick wax coating and a label saying they don't need water. How is that possible?

That's right. A healthy Hippeastrum bulb has everything it needs to grow and flower: water reserves, nutrients, and pre-formed flower buds. By giving it a wax coating, you protect the bulb from drying out. The roots are trimmed off, and you'll see it still grows into a stunning flowering plant. The only difference is that — without roots — the plant can't absorb new energy, so the bulb won't bloom again the following year.

You're planted in a pot with compost. Why does one third of your bulb stick out above the soil?

During growth and flowering, I love water. Give me a good drink about twice a week to keep the soil nicely moist. But... too much moisture will cause my bulb to rot — especially the top part, which is the most sensitive. Now you understand why I like to keep the top of my bulb high and dry, don't you?







Bonsai Brings Balance

7 Tips for the Bonsai Section



Intro

Bonsai – its graceful form and tranquil presence bring harmony to any space. But the true beauty also lies in the care: pruning new shoots, shaping branches, attentively observing small changes. This is not a rushed task but a moment of stillness, a ritual to savour.

In caring for a bonsai, not only the tree grows, but the soul too.

Cross-selling

Make it easy for the customer **and** increase the average spend by displaying complementary items nearby:

- Bonsai feed
- Bonsai soil
- Bonsai tools
- Bonsai pots
- Binding wire
- Bonsai books



Showstopper

There are three reasons to place one or several striking large/exclusive bonsai:

- Showstopper

Subconsciously, customers pause to look and don't walk past the section.

- Influencing price perception

Customers first see the high price, which sets a reference point. The standard bonsai suddenly seems 'very affordable' in comparison.

- Emotion

The showstopper elevates the status of the section. The whole range feels more exclusive, and the customer feels inspired.




Presentation

With bonsai, the beautiful ceramic pot is an essential part of the product. Unfortunately, this is not well showcased when displayed on a garden centre table with raised edges. Present your bonsai selection on attractive tables without edges.

Every specimen deserves to be seen. Creating plenty of height variation works very well.

Tip: If you only have tables with raised edges, fill them up to the rim with something like bark.




Like paintings on the wall

If you have the option to present bonsai vertically, definitely do so. It greatly improves visibility and allows the shapes to be fully appreciated. A vertical wall attracts attention and displays bonsai as true works of art.



Take good care of bonsai on the shop floor too. Remember to keep the soil moist. Don't place bonsai in draughts or in full sun near the glass.







What happens when the grower you've arranged to meet at his 15-hectare nursery turns out to be a walking encyclopaedia of conifers? Answer: a very interesting afternoon and a head spinning with information. That grower is Paul Bremmer. I'll try to capture his passion for conifers in words.

Before we've even properly started our tour, I'm already standing with a blue-grey conifer in my hands.

Look, this is a *Chamaecyparis pisifera* 'Squarrosa'. I saved this variety from extinction. There were only ten plants left in the Netherlands. I bought them and started propagating from cuttings. By now it has become well-known and loved in the market, especially at Christmas, because of its beautiful blue colour.

How did you develop such a passion for and knowledge about conifers?

When I started working at my father's nursery in 1993, it was still a typical Boskoop nursery with a wide range of plants, including conifers. Nurseries began to specialise, and we followed that path. Choosing conifers was an easy decision. I enjoy acquiring knowledge and I immersed myself in the fascinating world of conifers. I love visiting arboretums and conifer nurseries all over the world. The fact that we now grow more than 150 species shows just how rich the world of conifers is.

How does Bremmer Nurseries distinguish itself from other conifer growers?

First of all, we're easy to recognise by the shape of our growing pots. We designed the black pots with a wide, flared rim ourselves. The rim makes it easy to lift the plants, and there's a notch in it for the plant label, which clicks securely into place once we insert it.

What also sets us apart is the breadth of our range – we have many specials. And, of course, the quality. Whether it's a *Taxus baccata* grown in large numbers or a special *Cedrus*, every plant is grown with care.

All our plants, except for one slow-growing pine, are grown in pots. That means they don't need to be dug from the open ground – a process plants always need to recover from. Instead, they can be traded all year round with their root system intact.

I was going to ask you about that – what do the seasonal peaks look like for you?

Conifers are green year-round and therefore always a solid basis for a garden centre's outdoor section. As with most garden plants, our peak is in spring. In summer, we sell many hedge conifers. That's because growers who sell them with a root ball stop doing so from late spring



Gymnosperms

Pines, spruces, larches, and cypresses are all examples of conifers. Conifers belong to the gymnosperms. The seeds are not enclosed by a fruit, but lie 'naked' on cone scales.



Is private label something for you?

The stick-in-pot rim labels are printed by the grower themselves. This offers many possibilities. With small, one-off start-up costs, you can have your conifers supplied with your own custom-designed label. There is no minimum order quantity.


Many customers choose to put the retail price on the label, saving them an extra price sticker. Want to change the price? No problem — the grower will make that adjustment free of charge.

Family business

Founder Cor Bremmer started growing roses in 1929. A generation later, in the early 1970s, Piet and Jaap were among the first growers to start growing in pots instead of in the open ground. They did much pioneering work in container cultivation. The next generation, Cornelis and Paul, took over around the turn of the century. Paul and Cornelis Bremmer are cousins and initially each had their own nursery. In 2006, the two nurseries merged to become Bremmer Nurseries.



The Latin word conifer means 'cone bearer'.
Conus = cone

Crossbreeding conifers

Breeding conifers is very difficult. Just try waiting for a seedling to grow into a mature tree with cones - it's almost impossible. No breeding takes place in Europe. In America, there is a grower with a vast estate full of mature conifers who does it.

Paul prefers to expand his range by paying close attention to mutants and unusual forms within a species on his own nursery. In the *Cedrus deodara*, two green plants were found. These have been propagated and are now being tested to determine whether this variant is suitable as a new cultivar.

In addition to various cultivars, there is a remarkably large number of botanical species to be found at the nursery. These are exact copies of natural species, but cultivated. You can recognise the difference by the name:



onwards, due to quality reasons. Towards Christmas, conifers really add to the atmosphere, so that's another important season.

As we drive the golf cart through the rows full of plants, we stop at each variety that has a good story behind it. I can't possibly share them all, but the one about Taxus baccata is too good to skip.

The Taxus baccata is a magnificent tree that originally grew abundantly in this part of the world. England also had beautiful forests full of yew. Yew wood is extremely strong, tough and flexible. In the Middle Ages, the English discovered that longbows made from yew could shoot further than anyone else's. This gave them a huge advantage on the battlefield and brought them great victories, such as the famous Battle of Agincourt. The trees were felled until no yew remained in England. They began importing yew wood from mainland Europe. Many old yew forests were cut down, and this once common tree became scarce throughout Europe. Let's work together to change that!

Do you see any trends in the conifer world?

Every region has its own preferences. In Scandinavia, they focus on species that are extremely winter-hardy. In other parts of Europe, that is less important, and people mainly look at form and colour. In Eastern Europe, colour contrasts are especially important. In England, I see a slight preference for species suitable for topiary. And the demand for blue-grey colour has grown across the entire market.

What would you like to say to garden centres and consumers?

I wish more people appreciated conifers the way I do. They provide shelter for birds, hedgehogs and insects. They give

year-round colour to the garden and are incredibly diverse. Let me list them: as a hedge, for topiary, as a rock garden plant, as a tree, as ground cover, and in a pot on the terrace. Add to that all the special shapes and colours, and you can see why an extensive range would be a welcome addition to any garden centre.

We end the tour next to the nursery. After making our way through the reeds, we arrive at a small lake.

The power of nature. We collect rainwater in our reservoir. In wet periods, any excess flows into this lake. The natural banks merge into a hedge of trees. This creates shelter for natural predators, such as parasitic wasps, ladybirds and predatory mites, which are more than welcome to do their useful work in our nursery. ■

The garden plants column

Pinus

Whether in nature, as a bonsai, or standing alone in a garden... I find **Pinus** truly beautiful. The scent released when the summer sun warms the resin in the pine wood, the colour of its needles, and its twisted, characterful forms are pure botanical poetry. Time to explore the world of **Pinus** more deeply.



O Christmas Tree

The **Pinus** is the true and only Christmas tree. O Tannenbaum (O Christmas Tree) is a traditional German song from the 16th century that became world-famous as a Christmas carol. Originally, however, it had nothing to do with Christmas - it was about loyalty and steadfastness, with the pine tree as its symbol. Read this column and you'll understand why **Pinus** is the perfect metaphor for resilience.

Pinus is a long-lived genus with a long-term vision: slow growth in youth lays the foundation for a long and healthy life.

Slow for a reason

Popular varieties such as *Pinus mugo*, *parviflora*, and *densiflora* are slow growers. But why is that? Many **Pinus** species have evolved to survive in nutrient-poor soils. They invest first in developing strong root systems rather than rapid above-ground growth, so they can efficiently absorb water and nutrients. In the early stages of their long lives, this means they grow very slowly above ground.

Slow growth also results in dense, resin-rich wood, making the tree more resistant to disease, insects, and even fire.

*The oldest trees in the world are pines. A grove of *Pinus longaeva* in California is more than 4,800 years old - and still alive. That means some pines were already standing before the pyramids were built!*

Pines communicate... through scent!

When a pine is attacked by insects, it can release aromatic compounds to "warn" nearby trees. Those trees then activate their own defences in advance.

What 'weapons' are deployed?

The tree increases its resin production: a sticky substance that traps and immobilises insects. The resin also contains compounds that kill harmful fungi and prevent further infection. In addition, the tree emits volatile organic compounds that attract natural predators of its attackers.





Fire as an ally

For millions of years, wildfires have posed a major threat to trees. But clever pine species like *Pinus rigida* and *Pinus palustris* have turned this danger into an opportunity. Thanks to thick, fire-resistant bark and branches that begin high up the trunk, they can survive fires. After the flames pass, their cones open and release seeds into the nutrient-rich ash.

This or that?



***Pinus mugo* 'Mops'** is a slow-growing dwarf pine. Low maintenance. Naturally forms a neat round shape without pruning. Grows just 3–5 cm per year. Great visual impact in the landscape.



Pinus sylvestris, by contrast, is a fast-growing pine. Perfect as a solitary tree in larger gardens. With an average growth of 40–50 cm per year, it becomes a sculptural tree with orange-red bark and an elegant crown of blue-green needles.

Care tips

Pinus is a tough, low-maintenance garden plant, as long as it gets plenty of sun and a well-drained soil.

- Choose a sunny spot
- Avoid heavy clay soils – light, sandy soil is best
- Water young plants during prolonged dry spells
- No fertiliser needed

What to remember:
